ARRL Rocky Mountain Division / Utah Hamfest July 2012

Updated June 8th 2012

Objective: Host a fun and competitive CW event / competition which will introduce 'Amateur Operators' to 'CW Contest Radio Sport' and 'CW Code Copy Competition'.

The competition will be split into two different events using **RufzXP** and **Morse Runner**. These are free Windows programs (links provided on the next page) designed to increase your code copying skills. RufzXP is accepted worldwide as the standard to gauge and rank an operator's ability to copy callsigns. Morse Runner is a very accurate simulation of 'running' at a big gun contest station in a worldwide CW contest. Both programs allow a CW Operator to post their scores on the Internet and track their worldwide rankings against other CW operators.

How do I Enter? Pre-registration is preferred, however we will try to accommodate anyone interested at the Hamfest. Several computers will be provided with headphones for potential practice runs and or competition runs. Personal headphones are encouraged and will be allowed for use with the provided computers.

For the Morse Runner competition, we are planning on running 10 minute pile up competitions using the **WPX** and or **HST** Morse Runner modes. You will want to practice using these modes. For the WPX mode we highly recommend practicing with all simulated QSB, QRN, QRM and LID options turned on.

Computers provided during the competition will be loaded with the default full RufzXP Callsign Database. You are encouraged to practice with the default database included in the install.

For the RufzXP competition, we are planning on a standard RufzXP sessions where you attempt to copy 50 callsigns. You set the starting speed. A correctly copied callsign speeds the sending of the next callsign and an incorrect copy of a callsign slows down the sending speed. Points are awarded for CW speed and correct callsign copy.

RufzXP Competition Specifics may be updated before or at the beginning of the competition. Practice with standard 50 callsign runs using the default RufzXP callsign database unmodified. NG7M & N7BAN reserve the right to change competition rules before the competition begins.
